Member Spotlight - Odessa Sadsad

My story begins in Zamboanga City, the vibrant "City of Flowers," where I was lovingly raised by my aunt and grandmother. They were strong, faithfilled women who taught me the virtues of perseverance, respect, gratitude, and service to others. From them, I learned that success is not measured by what we achieve alone, but by how we uplift those around us. Their lessons became the compass that continues to guide my work and life.

The rhythm of home still lives within me— in the sound of Chavacano, the language that carries the warmth and melody of Zamboanga. Wherever I go, I carry that music in my heart.

When I was seven, my mother made a courageous decision to immigrate to the United States, hoping to build a better future for our family. My grandmother — a formidable woman with an unshakeable spirit — raised my younger brother and me in her care. Ten years later, we reunited with my mother in the U.S. I was midway through nursing school at the time, but thepull of home led me back

back to the Philippines, where I completed my Bachelor of Science in Nursing from Western Mindanao State University. Shortly after graduation, I returned to New Jersey to begin a new chapter — one that would test, transform, and ultimately define me.

In my early 20s, I began my career as a Registered Nurse in Toms River. But the curiosity of youth and a deep love for adventure soon beckoned. One evening, while browsing online, I stumbled upon an advertisement seeking men and women to become flight attendants. I had no aviation experience, but something in me said go. So I called out from work, dressed in my best suit, and drove to North Jersey for the interview. That single leap of faith changed my life.

Before long, I was flying across the world — working for a charter company that transported NFL teams, living for a time in Venezuela while flying with their national carrier, and eventually joining a start-up company, JetBlue Airways, in New York. Through these experiences, I discovered the extraordinary power of human connection — how kindness transcends language, and how shared stories make the world feel smaller. Over the years, I've been blessed to travel to more than 25 countries, each journey deepening my appreciation for culture, diversity, and resilience.



Still, amid the constant motion of airports and new horizons, I found myself missing something — the sense of fulfillment that came from caring for others. My heart had never truly left healthcare. As my travel schedule allowed, I returned to nursing, this time with a renewed sense of purpose. I later pursued my Master's in Healthcare Administration, merging my clinical foundation with my passion for leadership and service.

Today, I am humbled to serve as the Vice President of Health Services for a not-for-profit organization — the largest senior housing provider in New Jersey and Delaware. In this role, I oversee quality, compliance, and clinical excellence across multiple service lines, including post-acute care, assisted living, home care, and health service firms. Every day, I'm reminded that leadership is not about titles, but about the lives you impact and the teams you inspire.

The late President of Cornell University, Frank Rhodes, once said: "Some will be lucky to find a job they love. Others will be luckier to find careers they love. But the luckiest of all will find their




