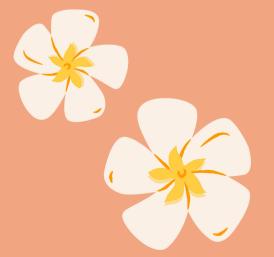
LETTER FROM THE EDITOR by Jamie Mariano

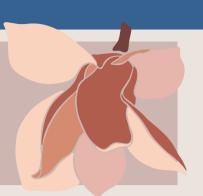

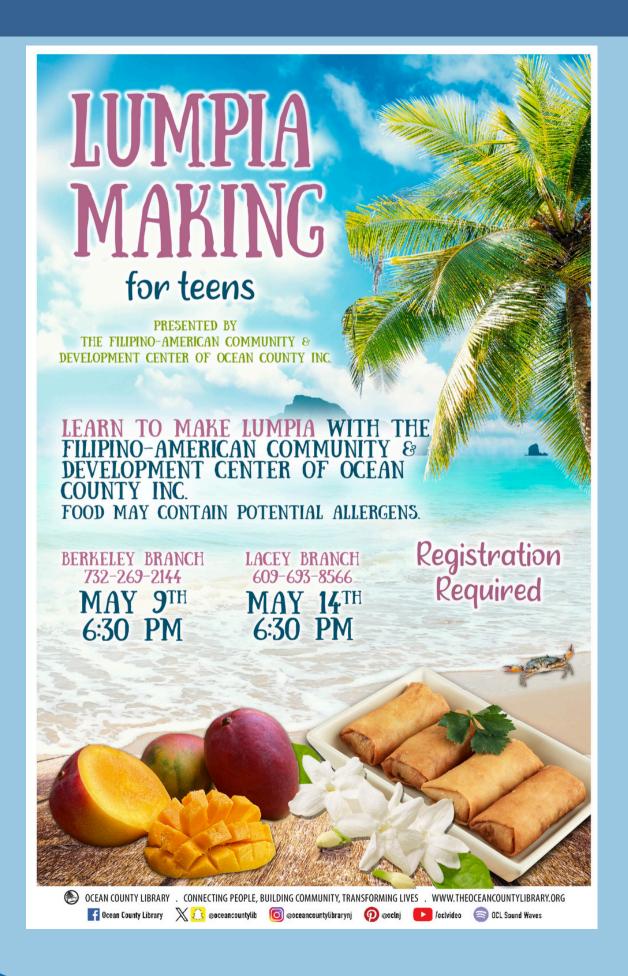
