

It's always fun to teach our kids in FCDC, and up to now I will always be available to share our FMA heritage. The excitement should never stop. That's why I teach private lessons both for kids and adults too.







My passion for Martial Arts is unconditional love. February of this year, my mother Leonor passed away, and I indeed really admired her unconditional love for her sons. She wouldn't start her meal without me coming from my 16-hour shift from work as Certified Nursing Aide (my job for 26 years up to now). And boy, how I miss her.

Ten months from now I'll be declaring my official year as a senior, I cannot wait for my free perks and discounts. As of now, I am enjoying short trips and travels, tasting fine wine and try interesting cuisines, visiting nature and parks, and seeing concerts along with Christine, my significant. By the way, I have Videoke every Saturday with my very competent Filipino friends too. And of course my ritual is to mingle with nature while throwing Arnis sticks or gloves for Muay Thai.

I should say from Juliet Roberts what she said in her movie -- to embark on a quest for self-discovery, and take yourself somewhere out of your comfort zone -- is that to "Eat, Pray, Love."

There are so many metaphors that we can think of in facing our life evolutions and transformations.


